Contractor Bid Requirements

Not all bids will look the same. However, before you send bids to providers they need to include, at a minimum, the following information to provide clarity for the review team.

If your bid does not include these items, it will be returned to you.

Materials

- Type of item or material
- Quantity of item
- Cost per unit
- Area of use

Examples:

6 storm windows for playroom and kitchen. \$160 per window

Laminate flooring, 600 square feet, for basement. \$1.25 per square foot.

Labor

- Purpose of each type of labor
- Cost of each type of labor

General Contractors:

Itemize each sub-contractors scope of work and wages.

Total Project Cost

- Include any costs not directly related to labor and materials, such as overhead and profit, general conditions, or insurance

Contact

- Contractor's name of business, address, and contact information
- ECE business name or provider's name and contact information
- Address of project location
- Contractor signature
